A wide range of teaching and learning tasks are implemented, such as lectures, practice sessions, autonomous work and assessment tasks.

4.2. Learning tasks

This is a 6 ECTS (150 hours) course organized as follows:

- Lectures (40 hours).
- Practice sessions (20 hours). Sessions where students work with case studies and problem-solving tasks.
- Autonomous work (20 hours).
- Individual study (65 hours).
- Assessment tasks (5 hours). A set of written exams.

4.3. Syllabus

The course will address the following topics:

1. **The standard of phonetic/phonological analysis in Hispanic linguistic studies.** Basic concepts for the description of Spanish sounds and phonemes.
2. **Spanish vowels.** Definition and description from an articulatory and acoustic phonetic perspective. Vowel sequences. Spanish vowel phonemes. The determination of phonological oppositions and of distinctive vowel features.
3. **Spanish consonants.** Definition and description from an articulatory and acoustic phonetic perspective. Spanish consonant phonemes. The determination of phonological oppositions and of distinctive consonant features.
4. **Syllable, accent and intonation in Spanish.**
5. **Morphonology.** Some problems in Spanish morphonology.
