4.1.Methodological overview

The methodology followed in this course is oriented towards achievement of the learning objectives. A wide range of teaching and learning tasks are implemented, such as:

- **Lectures.** The teacher presents and discusses in the classroom the theoretical and methodological aspects of the course contents. Student participation is encouraged.
- **Practice sessions** supervised by the teacher. Its aim is that students are able to take decisions for solving problems related to land use, as well as familiarize them with key information sources and the proper treatment of the obtained information by applying the most common methods and techniques.
- **Seminars.** They promote, through discussion and exchange of ideas, reasoning and communication skills.
- **Field work.** It allows students to observe "in situ" and interpret some cases of territorial disorders and of ordered

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spaces.

- **Tutorials.** They facilitate the monitoring of the teaching-learning process and preparation of tasks and seminars, in group or individual tutorial sessions.

4.2.Learning tasks

The course includes the following learning tasks:

- Lectures (15 hours).
- Practice sessions (10 hours). The methods and techniques commonly used in regional planning will be taught.
- Seminars (6 hours). In small groups they will take place in the last days of the semester.
- Field work (9 hours).
- Tutorials. The supervision of practical tasks, seminar-preparation and student guidance will be held in the teacher's office.
