#### **4.1.Methodological overview**

All the students are required to write a Master's Dissertation on a chosen topic. There are four types of dissertation: Academic research, laboratory research, job experience or stay in another center.

The learning and teaching methodology developed is designed to help the students to choose and define their research aims, to select appropriate research methods and techniques, and to write up the analysis and interpretation of the findings in a logical and well-structured document supported by relevant references to the literature review. The students work under the guidance and supervision of at least one advisor. By the end of the research period a written document of at least 12,000 words must be prepared according the following structure:

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- Introduction
- Background and state of the art
- Objectives and Methodology
- Analytical Development
- Conclusions
- List of sources, bibliography and resources used
