4.1.Methodological overview

The methodology followed in this course is oriented towards achievement of the learning objectives. A wide range of teaching and learning tasks are implemented, such as lectures, practice sessions, workshops, autonomous work and assessment tasks.

The course includes the following learning tasks:

- Topic 2. Practical experimentation on the audiovisual technical aspects and devices. Solving of problems and cases by means of specific software.
- Topic 3. Initiation into essential techniques for audiovisual project production. Solving of problems and cases by means of specific software.
- Topic 4. Critical review of the contemporary scene related to art and new media. Theoretical presentation, commentary and discussion.
