- 3. Describe the most important features of the various genres and recognise the generic classification of Spanish and Hispanic literary texts.
- 4. Analyse the components of literary work and assess the appropriateness and meaningful relevance of literary resources in Spanish and Hispanic literary texts.
- 5. Use the fundamental sources of knowledge and references in order to learn about literature and for the beginning of the scientific work into it.
