4.1.Methodological overview

The methodology followed in this course is oriented towards the achievement of the learning objectives. A wide range of teaching and learning tasks are implemented, such as lectures, practice sessions, autonomous work, study, assessment tasks and attendance of company managers.

Students are expected to participate actively in class throughout the semester.

4.2.Learning tasks

This is a 6 ECTS course organized as follows:

?**Lectures** (1 ECTS: 10 hours). The teacher presents theoretical contents illustrated with relevant examples.

?**Practice sessions** (1 ECTS: 40 hours). They can include discussion and presentation of case studies, practical work outside the classroom (field work or visits), and seminars.

?**Autonomous work** (1 ECTS: 10 hours). Students do tasks such as study, readings, preparation of practice sessions and seminars, and summative assignments.

?**Tutorials** (0.5 ECTS: 5 hours). Office hours can be used to solved doubts and for follow-up of students' learning progress.

?**Assessment tasks** (0.5 ECTS: 5 hours). A final written examination.

The course will address the following topics:

- Topic 1. Development of a professional blog with accounting and financial approach (LinkedIn).
- Topic 2. Financial and accounting information. Search systems.
- Topic 3. Economic-financial decision-making models designed through a spreadsheet applied to accounting analysis.
- Topic 4. Economic-financial decision-making models designed through a spreadsheet applied to financial transactions.
- Topic 5. Systems of Integral Management of the Enterprise (ERP).
- Topic 6. SIFC applied to the fulfillment of commercial obligations.
- Topic 7. SIFC applied to compliance with tax obligations.
