- Topic 1. Definition.

- Topic 3. 14th and 15th centuries: old master prints; Andrea Mantegna and Martin Schönauer; movable-type printing press; illustrated books, paper and ink.
- Topic 4. 16th century: Albrecht Dürer and Marco Antonio Raimondi.
- Topic 5. 17th century: Rembrandt van Rijn and Jacques Callot.
- Topic 6. 18th century: William Hogarth and Giovanni Battista Piranesi.
- Topic 7. Francisco de Goya.
- Topic 8. 19th century: techniques, *eau-forte moderne* and *le belle épreuve*; the painters-engravers: Edouard Manet and Edgar Degas; lithographic posters: Jules Chéret, Eugène Grasset, Henri Toulouse-Lautrec and Alphonse Mucha; Japanese woodblocks: Mary Cassatt.
- Topic 9. The first half of the 20th century: Pablo Picasso.
- Topic 10. The second half of the 20th century.
