The subject of General Psychopathology applied to General Health Psychology aims to provide the student with the necessary knowledge about mental disorders based on the DSM and CIE categorical models, and based on the explanatory psychopathological models of the different mental disorders, with the objective to be able to make case formulations properly, to propose a correct evaluation and diagnosis of psychological and health problems, to formulate explanatory hypotheses of the relationship between mental psychopathology and disease processes, to improve the performance of functional analysis and intervention proposals.
