4. Methodology, learning tasks, syllabus and resources

4.1. Methodological overview

This course is conceived to be mostly practical. In some topics, teachers try to transmit their vision on the actual state of the question: which aspects are the most relevant (based on their frequency, implications, etc.), which ones are still unsolved and, therefore, are research niches. Those issues will be developed in concrete research projects, with the help of specific and adequate samples from appropriate settings, as well as reliable and valid instruments and their procedures. Both qualitative and quantitative research approaches have their own specific statistical methods. Despite accurate and detailed methodological aspects can be studied in other courses, there are competences students need to acquire in order to conceive, design and write down a successful research project to pass the course.

4.2.Learning tasks

The course includes the following learning tasks:

- Teaching sessions: Each topic of the syllabus will be presented, analyzed and commented by the teachers as follows:
 - -Firstly, a research specialized paper or protocol will be presented.
 - -Secondly, small group discussion will be encouraged.
 - -Thirdly, a general discussion will follow.

-Finally, relevant conclusions will be pointed out.

Guided assignment: Each student will design and present an individual work on one of the course topics. Students
have to decide and ask for their supervisors (distribution of teachers will depend on their teaching commitments).
Before the deadline, each student will send (with due receipt) their work to their supervisor. A second copy will be
sent (also with due receipt) to the Department of Medicine, Psychiatry and Dermatology (sed1007@unizar.es) with
the following heading: "Master's, Research on Psychiatry".
