4.1.Methodological overview

The learning process that has been designed for this course comprises two activities: the writing of a paper under the supervision of an advisor and its defense in front of a committee. Under the guidance of the advisor, the student will go through the necessary sources to obtain relevant information in order to analyze the issues related to the paper. The dissertation (TFG) therefore must reflect the work developed autonomously and individually by the student.

The dissertation may take one of the following formats: A) A written paper. It may even be referred to a stay/It may be carried out during an abroad stay in another University. In any case, the public defense of the paper must take place in all cases at the University of Zaragoza's Faculty of Law. B) A report on the results of the student's internship at companies or institutions. This report may take two forms:

- Opinion on a legal issue dealt with during the internship. For example, an opinion on a trial in which the Student has assumed a leading role whether contributing with jurisprudence and doctrinal studies for the legal foundation of the positions of her client.
- A professional project developed by the student during their internship that involve the development of competences associated to the Degree in Law. For example, the design of an IPO of a company in which the student has participated in a direct way, or on how to approach legal urban planning.

Due to the specificity of this course, the learning tasks consist on tutorials with the advisor and autonomous work.
