4.1.Methodological overview

Group sessions for power point presentations.

Activities and practical tasks in the classroom, along the semester.

4.3.Syllabus

This programme consists of a number of modules outlined below:

- 1.- The language of courtesy and politeness.
- 2.- Offering solutions to guests' problems. Apologising.
- 3.- Dealing with complaints on the phone.
- 4.- Introduction to business letters/Enquiries/Apologies.
- 5.- Tourist Information Centres and tourist guides: guided visits, describing monuments, giving information on accommodation, sights and transport.
- 6.- Tour operators and travel agents: planning a travel itinerary.

4.4.Course planning and calendar

The sessions for the activities, along the semester, will be scheduled according to the academic calendar and the first- semester timetable. Students will be informed for the presentation and accomplishment of the tasks and in-classroom activities.

There will be four theoretical-practical sessions per week. The topics in the program will be used to reinforce the four skills: writing, reading, listening and speaking.
