4.1.Methodological overview

The learning process that is designed for this subject is based on the following:

The student must follow the training activities agreed with the director of the Final Project, which shall depend on the proposed theme and scope of the project.

The Final Project will consist of work with sufficient elements of personal creation, which reveal the knowledge, skills, aptitudes, and attitudes acquired by the student throughout the degree. The complexity and the level of requirements established in its development will involve an estimated total workload of 12 ECTS credits.

4.2.Learning tasks

They must be agreed in each case with the director or directors of the Final Project.

4.3.Syllabus

Given the peculiar character of the Final Project, there is no syllabus.

4.4.Course planning and calendar

The calendar of academic activities must be agreed in each case with the director or directors of the Final Project.

Within the general schedule, the Final Project is framed in the second semester of the fourth year. However, the students can start it anytime as long as they meet the requirements set out in the regulations currently in force. The University and the Center shall establish several deadlines for deposit and defense for each academic year.

The student will enroll in the Final Project in the period established for this purpose, analogously to the subjects that make up the degree. A Final Project proposal must be made in the format indicated in the regulations of the Center, which may be presented at the Secretariat of the Center at any time, but always at least 2 months before the expected date of deposit. The proposal must be approved by the Academic Committee of the Degree. Once the Final Project has been completed, the director must authorize their deposit and defense according to a standard report.
