1. General information

1.1. Aims of the course

The subject and its expected results respond to the following approaches and objectives:

The overall objective of this subject is to achieve the student's linguistic competence in the field of the French language. Students are expected to master the French language with a high level of B2), developing skills and strategies that allow them to later face the fields of specialization in which they will perform their profession. Since Spanish is the reference language of the vast majority of people who enroll in the subject, it is also necessary to address the translation process and develop the capacity for contrastive discrimination to become familiar with the fundamental differences between the two languages ??(French and Spanish).

Finally, the objective of the subject is to put into practice, on a transversal basis, the grammatical knowledge acquired to date, acquire new linguistic and cultural knowledge, and know how to apply them in various situations, contexts and supports.

1.2. Context and importance of this course in the degree

The content of the subject responds to the need for future graduates in journalism to complete their specific training with specialized knowledge of French language and culture at a high level, given that their professional work will be developed in a world every time more globalized in which the mastery of other languages - in addition to one's own - is an indispensable requirement, especially in the context of the European Union.

Continuous evaluation based on the activities programmed throughout the course and the oral exam, according to the following parameters:

1. Based on a concrete subject previously elaborated. It will account for 25% of the final grade and the degree of elaboration and organization of the work, the ability to publicly expose the topic, correctness in pronunciation and the use of audiovisual media will be assessed.

The methodology followed in this course is oriented towards the achievement of the learning objectives. It is based on active participation, case studies, teamwork etc. that favor the development of communicative skills and critical thinking. Students are expected to participate actively in the class throughout the semester.
