4.1. Methodological overview

The methodology followed in this course is oriented towards the achievement of the learning objectives. It favors the acquisition of knowledge related to physiotherapy, especially, with the initial process of assessment and functional diagnosis. A wide range of teaching and learning tasks are implemented, such as lectures, practice sessions, assignments, and autonomous work.

Students are expected to participate actively in the class throughout the semester.

Classroom materials will be available via Moodle. These include a repository of the lecture notes used in class, the course syllabus, as well as other course-specific learning materials, including a discussion forum.

Further information regarding the course will be provided on the first day of class.

4.2. Learning tasks

This is a 6 ECTS (150 hours) course organized as follows:

? Lectures (15 hours). Whole group sessions of 50 minutes each one. The professor will explain the theoretical contents, which are available in advance on the virtual platform Moodle.

? Practice sessions (30 hours). Sessions where students work with case studies and problem-solving tasks.

? Case studies (15 hours). In small groups, sessions where students work with case studies and problem-solving tasks.

? Autonomous work (90 hours). Time devoted to study the course contents and prepare the sessions and assignments.

4.3. Syllabus

The course will address the following topics:

TOPIC 1. Assessment in the intervention process in Physiotherapy. Characteristics, stages and resources of the evaluation process in Physiotherapy.

TOPIC 2. Ergonomics in the Physiotherapy Assessment process.

TOPIC 3. Data recording. Physiotherapy clinical history.

TOPIC 4. Assessment procedures in Physiotherapy. Manual assessment, palpatory sensitivity.

TOPIC 5. Assessment and diagnosis of the tissues and structures of the musculoskeletal system

TOPIC 6. Bases of the Physiotherapy diagnosis.
