4.1. Methodological overview

The learning process designed for this subject is based on the following: Comprehension and analysis of the texts indicated at the beginning of the course. Monitoring, debate and control of the audiovisual media programmed in the practical classes. Presentation of contents in-person classes, expanded with the recommended bibliography. Progressive acquisition of knowledge and resources of the historian profession, highlighting the value of interdisciplinarity.
