- Topic 2. Transition from the Antiquity to the Middle Ages: the Visigoths in Hispania (5<sup>th</sup>-7<sup>th</sup> Centuries).
- Topic 3. The Formation and Development of an Oriental Civilization in the Iberian Peninsula: al-Andalus (8<sup>th</sup>-10<sup>th</sup> Centuries).
- Topic 4. The Rise of New Societies in Northern Spain: the Christian Kingdoms and Principalities (8<sup>th</sup>-10<sup>th</sup>

centuries).

- Topic 5. The Feudal Golden Age (11<sup>th</sup>-13<sup>th</sup> Centuries).
- Topic 6. The Late Middle Ages: From the Crisis to the Recovery. Towards the Formation of the Modern State (14<sup>th</sup>-15<sup>th</sup> Centuries).
