4. Methodology, learning tasks, syllabus and resources

4.1. Methodological overview

The learning process that has been designed for this subject is based on the following:

Presentation by the teacher of the basic grammar and usage elements of the Arabic language.

Oral and written practicing of the topics covered in the face-to-face sessions with the active participation of the student.

Individual homework to consolidate the theoretical contents.

4.2. Learning tasks

The program offered to the student to help him achieve the expected results comprises the following activities:

Presentation by the teacher of the linguistic situation in the Arab world and of the basic questions of the Arabic language in its grammatical and usage aspects.

Individual and group writing and reading exercises where the student acquires the ability to use the Arabic spelling and phonetics correctly.

Reading and listening of texts on the topics proposed, adapted to the students' language level.

Pronunciation and writing exercises on these texts, applying the comprehension skills acquired.

Written and / or spoken composition (including group conversation) related to the topics covered in the unit, applying expression skills.

Grammar problems solving, focusing especially on the new aspects introduced in each content unit.

Outside the classroom, the student must carry out several activities directed by the teacher and aimed at consolidating their language skills.

1.1. Introduction to the situation of the Arabic language in the world. The phenomenon of diglossia.

1.2. Introduction to the phonology and phonetics of the Arabic language: consonants and vowels.

1.3. Presentation of the aliphate.

2.1. Oral skills: Introductions and greetings.

2.2. Grammar: Independent pronouns. The structure of equational sentences. Interrogatives. Vocative.

2.3. Vocabulary: Useful expressions for everyday use.

3.1. Oral skills: Nationalities and professions. Asking and giving personal information.

3.2. Grammar: Nominal morphology. Noun-adjective phrase.

3.3. Vocabulary: Names of countries, *nisba* adjectives and professions.

4.4. Course planning and calendar

Face-to-face sessions last two hours twice a week, according to the Faculty's class schedule, from September to January.

For students opting for continuous evaluation, two written and oral tests will be carried out in the middle and at the end of the semester. Likewise, they must deliver the materials of the practical exercises and directed activities that the teacher will request in due course during the teaching period.

For the global assessment test (oral and written) there are two official calls during the course: January and September, which will be published by the Centre.
