#### 4.1. Methodological overview

The learning process is based, on the one hand, on the presentation and teacher's explanation of the most relevant aspects regarding the theoretical and methodological bases of Linguistics. This presentation is framed within the participatory master class model, so that not only does the teacher intervene but the students have to actively participate through questions, presentation of data, etc. On the other hand, students will complement the teacher's work by carrying out, outside the classroom, the various scheduled tasks (activities, written work, exam). These tasks will put into practice and deepen the theoretical-practical aspects learned in the classroom.

#### 4.2. Learning tasks

1. Lectures.

Participatory master classes (theoretical-practical) in the classroom. Exhibition, debate and clarification of doubts on theoretical-practical aspects of the contents of the program.

2. Supervised activities.

Individual and group tutorials. Advice and help with any aspect of the subject, including taking continuous assessment tests.

3. Autonomous activities.

Individual and collaborative tasks, corresponding to the different units of the program, as well as the use of the virtual learning environment.
