4.1. Methodological overview

The designed learning process for this subject will be based on the following:

The practical contents will be held in classrooms and laboratories available for this purpose, in order to apply the theoretical contents by means of some proposed practical exercises: individual work, teamwork, discussion, debates and laboratory activities. Students will carry out activities that will eventually facilitate the acquisition and development of the core competencies of the subject, as well as critical thinking, team working, learning to discuss. They will be asked for individual or group reports which translate both reflections and learnt concepts as well as skills, abilities and attitudes, all of them developed along the course. All the former is considered essential to face the next topics to be studied in the degree and it will be especially important to properly acquire professional skills as Psychologist.

4.2. Learning tasks

Learning activities:

1. Lectures (30 hours, 3 ECTS credits max.)
2. Practical sessions (groupal) (20 hours, 2 ECTS credits)
