4.1. Methodological overview

The aim of the Master's Final Project (MFP) is to enable students to apply and develop a range of skills and competences acquired throughout the Master's Degree. Students are expected to show their competence in planning, writing and defending a piece of research on a topic. This process is mainly based on the student's autonomous work but his/her progress will be supervised by a supervisor in tutorials throughout the academic year.

The MFP will be integrated, at least, by the following elements: summary (in more than one language), introduction (which must include the justification of the work, the state of the question, the objectives, and the applied methodology), the analytical development of the research and conclusions, and a list of sources, bibliography and resources or materials used. University Regulations include some warnings against plagiarism that must be borne in mind.

4.2. Learning tasks

The student is expected to attend an induction section in which guidelines for initial dissertation preparation will be provided.

To prepare the MFP draft, the student is expected to engage in autonomous work (use of the library, reviewing the literature, writing the draft of the MFP and revising the draft).

Additionally, the student can set up regular appointments for office hour consultation.

4.3. Syllabus

The MFP may deal with any of the subjects taught in the Master's Degree: Specific grammatical problems in teaching and learning SFL, information and communication technologies in the SFL classroom, the application of pragmatics to teaching languages and the analysis of intercultural communication, the selection of linguistic resources for the teaching of specialty languages, the diatopic and social variation in the SFL class, the evaluation of the competences to use the language, literature and cinema as sources of didactic resources for the teaching and learning of Spanish, the analysis and preparation of materials for the Spanish class, the expression of Hispanic social and cultural aspects in the materials for teaching and learning of Spanish, etc.

4.4. Course planning and calendar

Schedule of basic activities under the supervisor's guidance:

1. Determining your topic, scope and purpose. It is strongly advised that the choice of topic and scope for your dissertation is completed by the first two weeks of the second semester.
2. Planning individual tutorials.
3. Progress reports (draft revisions).
4. Final editing and proofreading. The final version of the MFP will be handed in to the supervisor at least two weeks before the deadline for official submission.
