## 4.1. Methodological overview

The learning process that has been designed for this subject is based on the combination of lecture sessions by the teacher with activities in the classroom (presentations, debates, etc.). In the first sessions, the lecturer will inform the student about the most relevant issues of the different content sections, exposed in this guide, and will provide, with the proper orientation and commentary, the bibliography and the most appropriate sources of knowledge for the deepening of his/her learning. Either for the activities that will be carried out in the classroom, and for those that they will have to carry out in their autonomous work time, students will have selected materials, either on paper or on digital platforms, and will receive instructions for their use. The results of the autonomous work of the students may be shared during practical class sessions.

## 4.2. Learning tasks

The work-plan offered to the student to help him/her achieve the expected results comprises the following activities:

Lectures 1 ECTS (25 hours): lectures, theoretical presentations, debates, various presentations.

Practical sessions 0.6 ECTS (15 hours): debates and presentation of topics.

Autonomous work 2.6 ECTS (65 hours): readings, preparation of practice sessions and seminars, and summative assignments.

Assignments 0.8 ECTS (20 hours): Students will complete assignments, problems and exercises related to concepts seen in laboratory sessions, lectures, and visits to documentary and bibliographic repositories.

Tutorials 0.8 ECTS (20 hours): problem solving.

Assessment tests/exams 0.2 ECTS (5 hours): written tests, individual interviews, oral presentations in class.
