4.1. Methodological overview

The methodology followed in this course is oriented towards the achievement of the learning objectives. It is based on active participation, case studies, teamwork etc. that favor the development of communicative skills and critical thinking. A wide range of teaching and learning tasks are implemented, such as lectures, practice sessions, autonomous work, tutorials, and assessment tasks.

Students are expected to participate actively in the class throughout the semester.

Classroom materials will be available via Moodle. These include a repository of the lecture notes used in class, the course syllabus, as well as other course-specific learning materials, including a discussion forum.

4.2. Learning tasks

Expository classes. Individual work. Directed debates on situations of today's society. Writing journalistic texts. Current tests. Meetings with media professionals.

4.3. Syllabus

The course will address the following topics:

- 1.- Journalistic genres and their evolution. Hybrid genera.
- 2.- The journalistic vision. Focus.
- 3.- Sources of information.
- 4.- Exposition and argumentation.
- 5.- Narration and description.
- 6.- The interview, the report, the criticism, the opinion article.
- 7.- The new narratives.

4.4. Course planning and calendar

The works of the theoretical part will be delivered the seventh week (the first) and thirteenth (the second) of the semester. The day is specified with the students depending on other deliveries, exhibitions, etc. Current tests are carried out every day of practical class.
