4.1. Methodological overview

The learning process designed for this subject is based on the following:

The learning process that has been designed for this subject is based, on the one hand, on the exposition and explanation by the teacher, in the classes, of the most relevant aspects that support literary education and the analysis of the corpus of children's and young people's literature from the diachronic and synchronic perspective in the interests of the training of the literary reader.

On the other hand, throughout the course, students will carry out individual and group tasks of analysis, reflection and application of the contents. The activities will involve an application of the contents and tools acquired from the theoretical point of view, as well as reflection on them.

4.2. Learning tasks

The programme offered to the student to help him/her achieve the expected results comprises the following activities:

Face-to-face activities (60 hours for the student):

1. Presentation of contents by the lecturer.
2. Final assessment test.
3. Practical work on the subject.
 - a) Participation in lectures and large group discussions.

- b) Performance of directed academic activities in the presence of the teacher, in small groups.
- c) Individual class activities. The activities will involve critical reflection, mastery of children's literary discourse and the contribution of a bibliographical search and scientific research.

Non-classroom activities (90 hours):

- a) Individual autonomous work Reading and personal study of scientific texts and creative works.
- b) Group directed academic activities. Critical commentary and discussion of scientific articles. Selection of the subject matter of the work.
Application of the guidelines offered in the tutorials.
Bibliographic research, subsequent search and analysis of the documentation provided. Writing of the work and subsequent evaluation.
Total hours of student work (150).
External outings will be considered, as well as the organisation of conferences or seminars with guest speakers to facilitate the acquisition of the subject's competences.
Tutorial monitoring and monitoring of students' work may be carried out telematically.
