Ancient Greece

Themes:

1. Genesis and formation of the *polis*. Crisis of the Archaic Period. Colonization, Lawgivers and Tyrants. Archaic Sparta. Archaic Athens.
2. The Persian Wars. The Athenian Democracy. The Athenian Empire.
3. The Peloponnesian War. The *Stásis*. The 4th century BC changes in Greece, and, particularly, in Athens.

Themes:

1. What Roman History? Documentary Sources, Timeline & Historical Imagination.
2. Political and territorial evolution of Rome, from its origins (8th century BC) to Late Antiquity (5th century AD): Institutions, Citizenship, and Construction of the Empire.
3. *Seventy Million of Romans*: socio-cultural aspects of the Roman world.
