4. Methodology, learning tasks, syllabus and resources

4.1. Methodological overview

The methodology that is developed in the course combines various learning situations, which address the following learning processes:

- Reading and exhibition of documentation and reference articles on theoretical topics, as a foundation of the
 practical side of the subject.
- Activities of application of concepts, debates and discussions around the observation and analysis of the language
 of Primary Education students, as well as curricular materials corresponding to different situations and levels of
 learning of the Aragonese language at this stage.
- Design and planning, by applying the strategies learned, of several teaching activities and resources appropriate to diverse contexts and to different methodologies, within the specialty
- Analysis and collective comment of the developed designs.

4.2. Learning tasks

Pressential activities (60 hours):

- 1. Exposition of contents by the teacher.
- 2. Final evaluation test.
- 3. Practices of the subject.

Regarding the practical pressential activities, they will consist of the presentation and comment of tasks in class. The teaching staff will determine the possibility of forming work groups and/or requesting individual work in order to carry out the the following activities:

- Realization in class of activities of reflection, comment, debate and application, from theoretical contents, legislation, technical procedures, scientific or academic texts, teaching resources, digital media, etc.
- Study and presentation of cases.

 Presentation of activities and/or didactic sequences for the teaching of Aragonese in Infant Education and Primary education.

The possibility of going on external trips or outings will be considered, as well as the organization of conferences or seminars with invited speakers who facilitate the acquisition of the skills of the subject.

Non-pressential activities (90 hours):

- 1. Autonomous work: readings and personal study of scientific texts and legislation in the area for comment and class discussion.
- 2. Reading and analysis of an evaluation test, teaching material, etc.
- 3. Carrying out directed academic activities, applying the guidelines offered by the teaching staff.
- 4. Study and exam preparation.
- 5. Volunteer activities. Students who wish so, on their own initiative or at the suggestion of the teaching staff, may volunteer activities or tasks related to the field of knowledge of the subject

The tutorial follow-up and the direction of works can be carried out telematically.
