4. Methodology, learning tasks, syllabus and resources

4.1. Methodological overview

The teaching-learning process of the subject Diatopic Variation of Aragonese will be developed in Aragonese by:

- theoretical classes, which will consist of the exposition and explanation of the different topics of the program;
- practical classes of linguistic geography, which will consist of the analysis, re- elaboration and interpretationof linguistic maps;
- practical classes on reading, analysis and commentary on dialect texts in the various varieties diatopics of Aragonese;
- individual work of students reading texts in different diatopic varieties, preparation maps of isoglosses from a given material and analysis and commentary on dialect texts.

The tutorial follow-up and the direction of works can be carried out electronically. For the study of the phonetic, morphological, syntactic and lexical characteristics of each variety diatopic will be used both deductive methods (identification of a variety from the recognition of the characteristics studied) and inductive (establishment of the characteristics of a given variety from reading texts).

4.2. Learning tasks

- Theoretical classes with expositive sessions: explanation of the different topics of the program.
- Linguistic geography practical classes: analysis, re-elaboration and interpretation of maps linguistic; making linguistic maps from a given material.
- Practical classes on reading, analysis and commentary on dialect texts in various varieties Aragonese diatopics: recognition in the texts of the specific characteristics and, from these, deduction of the

diatopic variety; establishment by induction, from the reading and the analysis of texts, of the characteristics of a given diatopical variety.

- Audio of various diatopic varieties: analysis, discussion, interpretation
- Development of individual work, by the students, of analysis, re-elaboration and interpretation of linguistic maps: recognition of isoglosses and dialect areas.
- Preparation of individual works, by the students, of analysis and commentary of texts in different diatopic varieties: description and classification of linguistic characteristics and, from there, by means of the opportune argumentation, identification of the diatopic variety.

4.3. Syllabus

Contents: phonetic, morphological, syntactic and lexical characteristics. manifestations written and oral. Studies and publications related to each of them. geography methods linguistics: isoglosses and dialectal areas.

- 1. Linguistic geography and dialectology. General concepts. Linguistic atlases and their exploitation. dialect monographs. Other materials for the study of areas linguistics and diatopical varieties.
- 2. The territory of Aragonese: dialect and isogloss areas according to the distribution of phenomena phonetic.
- 3. The territory of Aragonese: dialect and isogloss areas according to the distribution of phenomena morphological and syntactic.
- 4. The territory of Aragonese: some dialect and isogloss areas, according to the distribution of lexical phenomena.
- 5. Western diatopic varieties.
- 6. The central diatopic varieties.
- 7. The oriental diatopic varieties.
- 8. The diatopic varieties of the intra-Pyrenean depression and pre-Pyrenean areas.
- 9. Southern diatopic varieties.

4.4. Course planning and calendar

Course 2022-2023. The subject is taught during the first semester, from mid-September until the end of January, approximately, throughout 15 weeks of classes, with two classes (of two hours each) per week. That is, there are 60 hours of face-to-face teaching.

It is estimated that an average student must spend an average of 150 hours on this 6-credit subject, hours, which must encompass both face-to-face and non-face-to-face activities. Dedication must be distributed evenly throughout the period.

The course consists of 6 ECTS credits, distributed according to this organization:

- Attendance at theoretical classes (exposure of content)............40 hours (face-to-face)
- Attendance at practical classes (exercises) 20 hours (face-to-face)
- Individual work (interpret. maps, text analysis)......30 hours (non-face-to-face)
- Attendance at tutorials (resolution of doubts)............................... 3 hours (face-to-face)
- Carrying out exams (written test)............. 2 hours (classroom)

Total student work = 150 hours (6 ECTS credits)

Calendar of face-to-face sessions and presentation of works:

1st and 2nd week: explanation of topics 1 and 2. / Exercises of interpretation, reelaboration and commentary of linguistic maps.

3rd, 4th and 5th weeks: explanation of topics 3, 4 and 5. / Exercises: reading and, where appropriate, listening to texts dialectal. / Presentation by the students of the first work, of linguistic geography. 6th and 7th weeks: explanation of topic 6. / Carrying out exercises: Reading dialect texts. Analysis and recognition of specific features in texts in different diatopic varieties.

8th, 9th and 10th weeks: explanation of unit 7. / Carrying out exercises: Reading dialect texts.

Recognition and analysis of specific elements in texts in different diatopic varieties.

11th and 12th weeks: explanation of unit 8. / Carrying out exercises: Reading dialect texts.

Recognition and analysis of specific elements in texts in different diatopic varieties.

13th, 14th and 15th weeks: explanation of topic 9. / Carrying out exercises: Reading texts dialectal.

Recognition and analysis of specific elements in texts in different varieties diatopic. / Presentation by the students of the second work, of analysis and commentary of a dialect text. 16th week: final written test.
