- 1) Todo estudiante del Máster debe realizar un trabajo de fin de Master al que le corresponden 15 créditos.
- 2) Este trabajo lo debe realizar bajo la dirección de un profesor doctor perteneciente a uno de los dos Departamentos que imparten el Master. El tema del trabajo se establecerá de común acuerdo entre el estudiante y su director
- 3) El trabajo habrá de presentarse en formato de artículo de revista, con una extensión de entre 25 y 40 páginas, incluyendo cuadros, gráficos v anexos.
- 4) Para el depósito de los trabajos se abrirán tres plazos, correspondientes a las convocatorias de julio, octubre y diciembre.
- 5) En cualquiera de estos tres periodos, el estudiante, después de haber cubierto los -45 créditos restantes del Máster, podrá depositar el trabajo en cualquiera de las secretarías de los dos Departamentos. Entregará tres copias en papel, así como una copia en PDF. Se deberá hacer el depósito también siguiendo las normas generales de la Universidad y Facultad que pueden consultarse en la página web de la Facultad.
- 6) En el momento del depósito, el director del trabajo comunicará al Coordinador del Máster su valoración sobre el mismo.
- 7) El estudiante presentará y defenderá su trabajo ante un tribunal integrado por tres profesores doctores. A la sesión, que será pública, asistirán obligatoriamente todos los estudiantes que hayan depositado su trabajo en la misma convocatoria.
- 8) El tribunal examinador comunicará al Coordinador del Master la nota asignada a los Trabajos de fin de Máster presentados.
- 9) La calificación del trabajo fin de Master corresponde totalmente al tribunal examinador, que tendrá como un elemento adicional para la evaluación, la valoración del director.

Nota: Está previsto que la evaluación se realice de manera presencial pero si las circunstancias sanitarias lo requieren o se produce otra circunstancia especial, se realizará de manera semipresencial u online.

4. Methodology, learning tasks, syllabus and resources

4.1. Methodological overview

The methodology followed in this course is oriented towards achievement of the learning objectives. It is based on:

- Continuous interaction with the supervisor
- Autonomous work
