1. General information

The general objective is to establish the theoretical foundations of journalistic genres and to provide the necessary skills for news writing.

- Apply with skill the professional knowledge and routines to the observation and selection of a news event, as well as to the selection and evaluation of sources in accordance with the news purpose, with indicators: use the criteria appropriate to the selection of the news event and the management of sources.
- Ability to organise complex communicative knowledge in a coherent way and to elaborate (write and edit) correctly informative journalistic messages in news format, with indicators: to understand and relate the concepts, principles and rules of news construction to the elaboration of news pieces.
- Ability to promote egalitarian awareness of individuals and peoples, respect for international human rights, with indicators: determine the values of respect for human rights in journalistic information and in the situations narrated.
- Adopt a favorable attitude towards respect for fundamental individual and collective values, with indicators: determine the values of respect for human rights in journalistic information.
- Show capacity for teamwork that facilitates the development of knowledge with a critical and responsible cultural exchange with indicators: show collaborative skills.

5. Assessment system

First call

Continuous assessment

- Journalism essay (20% of the final grade). Correction criteria: writing, expository and argumentative effectiveness, presentation and spelling, comprehension, analysis and relation of ideas and concepts.
- Current events: (20% of the final grade). Correction criteria: correct answers and spelling.
- Writing practice (40% of the final grade). Correction criteria: writing, application of theoretical principles, presentation and spelling.
- Examination: (20% of the final grade). Correction criteria: writing, knowledge and understanding of the concepts, ability to relate and apply them, and spelling.

Global assessment

It will be held according to the official examination schedule. It will consist of three parts:

- Theoretical part: (30% of the grade). The format and correction criteria are the same as in the continuous evaluation exam.
- Current events: (20% of the grade). The format and correction criteria are the same as those used during the continuous evaluation.
- Writing of two news items: (50% of the grade). The format and correction criteria are the same as those used for during the continuous evaluation.
