1. General information

The subject Cultural Bases of Communication: The goal of the History of Cinema and other audiovisual media is the study of these manifestations, from the end of the 19th century to the beginning of the 21st century, placing this production in the historical-cultural context in which it arose.

Goals:

- a) To know the fundamentals of the history of cinema in all its manifestations, movements and trends, the filmmakers and fundamental works of each period, and to connect them with other contemporary forms of cultural expression.
- b) To understand the different formal languages and the different cinematographic and audiovisual trends developed during this period.

4. Academic activities

1) Theoretical classes: they will adopt the format of oral expositions by the professor of the theoretical contents of the subject in the classroom.

2) Practical classes:

a. Practice in analysis, commentary and interpretation of films for cinema through the projection of complete works or fragments of them and class discussion of their form and narrative structure, applying different methodologies.

b. Commentary and analysis of sources and texts.

3) Personal study; assimilation of the contents exposed in the theoretical and practical classes, reading and study of the recommended bibliography, previous personal preparation of the commentaries and analysis of texts and sources.

4) Tutorials: the time dedicated to the orientation of the student's learning, to the discussion of the problems arisen in the development of the subject.

5. Assessment system

First Call

Global assessment

A) Individual work (up to 25% of the final grade). The student will be able to choose one of these options:

-Written work: result of readings and personal reflections on a topic previously specified with the teacher. Different options will be offered on the first day of class at.

B) Written test or exam (up to 75% of the final grade): The minimum grade for individual work will be 5 out of 10, so that the test will be graded up to 10 points. It will consist of two parts:

-Theoretical part: written development of a topic based on a statement.

When grading the topic, preference will be given to good presentation, formal and orthographic correctness, and the correct exposition and structuring of the ideas.

Likewise, it will be taken into account that the student performs a reasoned examination, in which the different contents and ideas are related. Likewise, the personal contribution, based on individual work, and the appropriate use of terminology will be valued.

-Practical part: commentary and analysis of several images, fragments and/or texts related to the History of Cinema. All of them seen in class.

A brief catalog card containing the following information should be drawn up: Title of the work, director, chronology, movement to which it belongs and brief evaluation of the work based on its industrial and aesthetic conditions.
