1. General information

The subject is part of the group of basic subjects of the new undergraduate degrees in Health Sciences . It focuses on the functioning of our psyche throughout the life cycle. Through the knowledge of these aspects, students will be able to identify the psychosocial needs, desires and beliefs of individuals, families, and other culturally diverse groups. As a consequence of all the above , students will be more tolerant and respectful of the needs of all people, being able to respond appropriately to them. The acquisition of skills related to communication, helping relationships, respect and appreciation of the ethnic and cultural diversity are also objectives of this subject. Specific aspects such as the helping relationship and the techniques of psychosocial intervention and the transcultural bases of care will be studied in depth.

Some common problems requiring psychosocial intervention.

- Detection, attention and referral in cases of violence or mistreatment in all areas.

4. Academic activities

1. Master classes (50 h).

The content of the master classes is theoretical (point 3. Program of the subject) and supported by manuals of reference, study materials provided by the teachers in Moodle, and recommended readings during the term.

2. Seminars (37 h).

5. Assessment system

Evidence of achievement of the intended learning results should be demonstrated through the following assessment activities:

1.-Attendance and participation in all seminars scheduled during the subject and completion of a portfolio and reflection on the content of the seminars (up to 30% - or 3 out of 10 points - of the final grade of the subject). The 30% is distributed as follows: 10% attendance, 10% participation and 10% portfolio.

If the student attends all the seminars, they will obtain 1 point of the total of the subject. This grade will decrease by 0.1 for each absence regardless of the cause (excused or unexcused).

If the student misses more than two seminars during the entire term without justification, they must take a seminar exam on the theory and practice of the seminars in order to obtain the 30% corresponding to this section.

Excused absences are only understood as those related to health problems demonstrated with medical justification. All other situations will not be considered as excused absences.

In the case of working people, students from other years who have to attend other university classes during the seminar schedule or people who have entered their studies as high performance athletes, this condition will be taken into account and it will be facilitated so that they can change their practice group in order not to miss seminars. However, they will have the same evaluation criteria as the rest of the students.

2.- Final exam of the subject (up to 70% - or 7 out of 10 points - of the final grade of the s).

The acquisition of theoretical knowledge explained in the lectures, and the ability to apply the theoretical content, skills and nursing competencies worked on in the seminars and work of the subject will be evaluated. There will be a 60-question multiple-choice test with 4 possible answers, only one of which is valid.

1 point will be deducted for every 3 failures.

The exam is considered passed with 36 correct answers which will be equivalent to 3.5 points out of a maximum of 7 that can be obtained with the exam. In case of not passing the exam (<36 correct questions), the subject will not be passed.

In case of repeating the subject and having passed the seminar part (point 1 of this section), the grade will be saved.

It is essential to pass both sections in order to pass the subject.
