1. General information

The academic approach of the subject of Criminal Law, Special Part, has as its main goal that the student to know, interpret and correctly apply all the criminal offenses of our criminal legal system.

This objective is aligned with the Sustainable Development Goal of the United Nations 2030 Agenda number 16 PEACE, JUSTICE AND SOUND INSTITUTIONS, in such a way that the acquisition of the learning results of the subject provides training and competence to contribute to some extent to its achievement.

2. Learning results

- Know, understand, interpret and critically analyse the different crimes included in the Criminal Code and in special criminal laws.
- Know and understand the elements of the legal theory of crime as applied to specific crimes.
- Know and understand the problems regarding the concurrence of laws and crimes.
- Identify the legal-penal problems of criminal offenses.
- Acquire skills for the presentation and resolution of practical cases in criminal matters. Analyse the criminal jurisprudence.
- Work in a team assuming different roles.

3. Syllabus

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4. Academic activities

- Lecture activities and systematization of knowledge by the teaching staff: 54 hours.
- Dynamic activities for teachers and students (resolution of practical cases, practices in the classroom or outside the classroom and seminars): 30 hours.
- Personal study of the student, tutoring, work completion: 46.5 hours.
- Assessment activities: 4.5 hours.

5. Assessment system

There are two systems:

1) Mixed system consisting of the following activities:

a) Evaluation of active participation by means of tests, assignments or practical cases throughout the term.

The overall result of these will be weighted by 30% of the final grade.

In any case, students who have not achieved an average of 5 (pass) in this part of the grade, will have to undergo the other assessment method, based exclusively on the final global test.

b) Final global test. It will consist of a series of theoretical-practical questions to be answered based on the learning results developed during the term. The grade will be weighted at 70% of the final grade. Students who do not obtain a minimum grade of 5 out of 10 points in this final written test will not pass the subject. Only on the basis of this grade will it be weighted with the grade of the evaluation of the activities developed during the term.

2) Simple system based exclusively on the final global test consisting of two parts: (a) The performance of the test described above (final global test).

b) Completion of a written exercise on the content of the subject, which demonstrates that the student knows how to analyse an issue from the perspective of criminal law.

The final grade of the overall test will be obtained from the weighted average of the exam grades, 70% for the first part and 30% for the second part, although in order to pass it is necessary to achieve at least a 5 out of 10 in each of them.
