1. General information

The approaches and objectives correspond to a theoretical-practical vision of the study of Greek literature in its historical dimension and to the exposition of the most accredited literary genres in the field of Greek society. The SDGs are:

The subject is a specialization in the techniques of analysis of Greek literary texts. It is recommended to have taken the subjects related to Greek language and literature of the first and second year; and regular attendance to classes, as well as continuous work.

2. Learning results

1. Understanding of Greek literature as a whole from a generic and periodological perspective.
2. Skill in applying modern currents of literary theory to Greek texts according to extrinsic and intrinsic criteria of literature.
3. Essential mastery of the complementary techniques of Greek philology for the comprehensive knowledge of texts.
4. Proficiency in the theory and practice of translation applied to Classical Greek.

3. Syllabus

- Introduction to the periodization and genres of Greek literature.
- The literature of the archaic period.
- Classical period literature.
- The literature of the Hellenistic and imperial period.

4. Academic activities

Considering the theoretical-practical condition of the subject, a series of essential themes of Greek literature will be presented in class, which the student will have to be able to interpret and study in the double condition mentioned above. The learning activities will focus on practical work with selected texts in accordance with the theoretical program developed.

5. Assessment system

First Call:

a) Continuous assessment

Test 1. Completion of several theoretical questions corresponding to the syllabus proposed by the teacher, to be studied in a non-face-to-face way, according to the program included in the chapter of programmed activities: (40% of the final grade)

Test 2. Completion of several theoretical-practical questions, with the support of literary texts in Greek language, corresponding to the topics that will be taught in the face-to-face classes: 40 % of the final grade.

Test 3. Reading of a scientific study, relevant to the subject, for its exposition or writing of the corresponding critical review: 20% of the final grade

b) Overall assessment

Same tests and evaluation criteria as in the Continuous Assessment.

Second Call:

Overall test identical to that of the first call.
