4. Academic activities

The most relevant contents of the subject are explained in the classroom lectures. The practical activities, improve the ability to analyse documents and the progressive development of intellectual autonomy. In the tutorial activity the teacher guides and stimulates the formative activity.

The program includes the following activities:

Classroom classes (1.25 ECTS): 31.25 hours. Readings and personal work (2.75 ECTS): 68.75 hours.

Practical activities (0.5 ECTS): 12.50 hours Tutorial activity (0,35 ECTS): 8.75 hours. Assessment activity or exam (0.15 ECTS): 3.75 hours.
