#### 1. General information

The purpose of this subject is to introduce the student to the study of museum theory and its practical application, so that they knows the tasks of the art historian in this essential field in the protection of historical and artistic heritage. It is recommended to take this subject in the case of students who aspire to professional opportunities in museums and heritage management and, in general, to those interested in art in the Contemporary Age.

# 2. Learning results

In order to pass this subject, the students shall demonstrate they has acquired the following results:

#### 4. Academic activities

The program offered to the student to help them achieve the expected results includes the following activities:

1) **Theoretical classes:** oral presentations by the teaching staff of the theoretical contents of the subject in the classroom (lectures)

#### 2) Practical classes:

 In the classroom: analysis, commentary and interpretation of museums and exhibitions. Commentary and analysis of sources and texts.

Commentary and analysis of the fundamental problems of the subject.

- Outside the classroom: programmed practical visits to apply the knowledge acquired by the student by analysing some specific museums on site
- 3) Study and personal work.

## 5. Assessment system

## First call

**Global assessment** (to be carried out on the date set in the academic calendar), which constitutes 100 % of the final grade, with the following assessment activities:

- -Practice report (20%): it will consist of answering 20 short questions. Criteria: wrong answers will not penalize and unanswered questions will not be taken into account. Duration: 15 minutes.
- -Individual work (20%): written essay on a specific topic indicated by the teacher at the beginning of the term Criteria: clarity and order in the presentation and synthesis capacity will be valued..
- **-Exam (60%):** this written test consists of the development of a topic related to the syllabus. Criteria: correct and reasoned presentation, the ability to relate ideas and knowledge and the personal contribution will be valued.

Duration: 60 minutes.
