- Unit 5: The golden age of capitalism, 1945-1973: changes in the forms of business and labor organization and construction and development of the Welfare State.

4. Academic activities

5. Assessment system

The summative assessment of the practices of type 2 of the subject will be carried out on the official dates indicated for this purpose prior to the final test, in which the degree of knowledge and competences acquired by the student in the type 2 practical sessions.

The assessment test of type 2 practices will include a multiple-choice test (multiple choice, true or false, etc.) (4 points). In the case of achieving a score of 5 or more out of 5, this test exercisewill be released and will only be carried out in the official and final call on the date indicated for this purpose question argumentative practice question (1 point).

The final assessment of the subject will be carried out in the official calls indicated for this purpose, in which the degree of knowledge and competences acquired by the student will be checked.

The single assessment test of the practical type 2 shall comprise a multiple-choice test (multiple choice, true or false, etc.) (4 marks) and an argumentative test (1 mark).

Regarding the theoretical part (a single test in the official call for all the students): The following tests are required students):

The test will be multiple-choice (true or false, etc.) (2.5 points) and the one taken in the official call at the end of the term will be argumentative (2.5 points).

In both assessment systems, the type 6 practicals are compulsory and will have a grade of 0.5 points which will be added to the grades achieved in the theory and type 2 practicals sections, without the final grade being higher than 10
