This subject provides students with the necessary knowledge of the acts of registration, contribution and collection in the Social Security system, as well as the introductory part and the part relating to the institutions and sources of the latter.

4. Academic activities

30 hours of resolution of practical cases previously carried out by the students and corrected in the classroom afterwards.

Resolution of questionnaires, practical problems and exams

5. Assessment system

Answer of 20 questions, test type, with 4 alternative items (8 of theory and 12 of practice) having to pass 60% of the correct answers to obtain 5 out of 10.

In the first ordinary exam, only 16 questions (8 of theory and 8 of practice) can be taken, if the student has passed the continuous assessment, obtaining a 1 out of 2.
