1. General information

The classes and the different evaluation tests will be adjusted to the Academic Calendar approved by the University and to the schedules established by the Faculty of Philosophy and Letters.

Although it is recommended, prior knowledge of Greek and Latin is not essential. On the other hand, regular and active attendance at classes and carrying out scheduled activities is recommended.

The objectives of the course are aligned with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) 4, 5, 10, 16 and 17 of the United Nations 2030 Agenda, in such a way that the acquisition of the learning results of the subject enables to contribute to some extent to its achievement.

2. Learning results

The course has a markedly instrumental character and aims to provide students with a practical knowledge of the instruments, techniques and methods that have characterized philological work.

4. Academic activities

- 2. Commentary on original Greco-Latin texts or their translations.
- 3. Autonomous work by the student, consisting of recommended readings and preparation of a work on a subject to agree, and tutored by the teacher.
