1. General information

The objective of this subject is for the student to demonstrate that:

They are able to carry out research work autonomously.

They are able to write it in a way that is adequate for its comprehension.

They are able to defend it in public.

2. Learning results

Upon completion of the preparation and defence of the master's final project (MFP) the student will be more competent to analyse economic problems in depth, face the need to collect data for analysis, contrast them with the help of a theoretical approach and know how to present and defend them in public.

3. Syllabus

This subject has no syllabus.

4. Academic activities

The development of the MFP will be done through meetings with the director who supervises the work.

5. Assessment system

- 1) Every student must complete a master's final project which is worth 15 ECTS.
- 2) This work must be carried out under the supervision of a doctoral professor belonging to one of the two departments that teach the master. The topic of the MFP will be mutually agreed between the student and their director.
- 3) The work should be presented in journal article format, with a length between 25 and 40 pages, including tables, graphs and annexes.
- 4) There will be three deadlines for the deposit of the MFP, corresponding to the July, October and December calls.
- 5) In any of these three periods, the student, after having completed the remaining -45 credits of the master's degree, may deposit the MFP in any of the secretariats of the two departments that teach the master. They will deliver three paper copies, as well as a PDF copy. The deposit must also be made in accordance with the general rules of the University and Faculty, which can be consulted on the Faculty's web page.
- 6) At the time of the deposit, the director of the work will communicate their assessment of the work to the master's coordinator.
- 7) The student will present and defend their work before a board of examiners composed of three PhD professors. All students who have deposited their MFP within the same call must attend the defence session of their peer students.
- 8) The board of examiners will inform the master's coordinator of the grade assigned to the MFP presented.
- 9) The grading of the MFP is entirely up to the board of examiners, who will consider the MFP director's evaluation as an additional element in their final grade.
