3. Syllabus

The program is structured as follows:

- Introduction
- · Historiographic approaches
- The concept of political representation in 19th century liberal Spain. Comparative perspective.
- The first liberalism: Cortes de Cádiz and the Liberal Triennium.

- The reign of Isabel II of Spain: liberal discourses and visions on political participation and electoral rights; electoral legislation and praxis
- The Democratic Sexennium: the conquest of universal male suffrage; cautions and fears of the universalization of electoral rights; praxis of the electoral processes
- The time of the political *turno pacífico* (rotation in office of a Liberal and a Conservative party: legislation, electoral praxis and formation of the Parliament during the Restoration.
- Spanish Republican electoral legislation

4. Academic activities

Teaching methodology:

- Master class: theoretical-practical exposition of the fundamental concepts.
- Seminar: study, discussion and solving of problems and case studies related to the theoretical and practical concepts based on the readings done by the students.

Training activities:

- · Expository classes
- Source and resource management
- Text analysis
- Personal work of the student on readings, texts, sources and resources for the preparation of other activities.
- Discussions
- Written development of a topic: individual work by students to prepare an essay.

5. Assessment system

First call:

a) Continuous assessment

- Attendance and participation 20% of the final grade Assessment criteria: regular attendance and willingness to actively participate in classroom activities
- Critical debate in the classroom: evaluation method of the students' interventions on the problems raised in the classes 20% of the final grade Assessment criteria: clarity of exposition and level of reflection and interpretation in the interventions
- Individual written work: evaluation of an essay on the content of the subject 60% of the final grade Assessment criteria: the ability to search for information, the extent of the information consulted, its analysis, writing and exposition according to academic rules as well as critical judgment including the student's own assessments

b) Global assessment test: written exam on the theoretical contents, texts and documents worked on in class. 100% of the grade Assessment criteria: acquisition of knowledge, coherence of the exposition, use of the specific bibliography and correct writing

Second call: global assessment test 100% of the grade Assessment criteria: the same as those of the global test in the first call.
