1. General information

This is a subject that belongs to the common module and is taught in the first semester. The objective is to provide students with the conceptual foundations of feminist thought through the critical analysis of relevant texts of contemporary feminism. 3. Syllabus

The thematic units of this subject are the following:

1. Genealogy and history of feminism.
2. Feminist movements and theories of the 19th and 20th centuries.
3. Feminisms of the 21st century.

4. Academic activities

The subject is taught by two areas of knowledge: Didactics of Language and Literature and Philosophy, dividing the hours proportionally between both of them.

5. Assessment system

First call

Continuous assessment:

On an ongoing basis: through practices and participation in discussions. At the end of the subject, an individual work will be

presented. It will consist of the analysis and critical reflection on one of the texts proposed by the teacher.

The overall evaluation: Final exam on the syllabus of the subject.

Second call

The second call coincides with the global evaluation. Total or partial plagiarism in any of the evaluation tests will result in "fail" with the minimum grade of the complete test (exam, portfolio of activities, practices report, etc.) in that call. In addition, the faculty member responsible for the subject will submit a report to the dean of the centre in case other sanctioning measures are considered.
