1. General information

The subject and its expected results respond to the following approaches and objectives: (a) to read, interpret and understand Greek texts in the light of the process of the constitution of philosophy.

b) to know the vocabulary and conceptual apparatus of ancient philosophy.

c) to acquire and practice appropriate study and philosophical intellectual work techniques (information search, evaluation and synthesis), as well as the use of bibliographic materials for the production of reports, commentaries or essays

5. Assessment system

First call:

Global assessment test (100%): Submission of an essay on the texts and problems studied in the subject.

Assessment criteria:

- the reflexive assimilation of the themes
- the autonomous reading of the greek texts
- the quality of the structure of the essay
- the relevance of the contents and the acquaintance with them
- the argumentative rigor as well as the clarity, conciseness and precision of expression

Second call: global assessment test identical to the previous one.
