### 1. General information

The main objective is the acquisition of basic rudiments of phonetics, morphology, syntax and lexicon, providing an approach to the classical sources in their original language, which allows to deepen their analysis and interpretation. ODS: Goal 4: Quality education; Goal 5: Gender equality; Goal 10: Reduction of inequalities; Goal 11: Sustainable Cities and Communities; Goal 12: Responsible Production and Consumption; Goal 13: Climate Action; Goal 16: Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions This subject effectively facilitates optimal progress in the development of subjects related to classical antiquity and Greek philosophy and its later influence in particular. No previous knowledge of classical languages is required to take it. It is considered necessary for the successful completion of the same the continued work by the student, class attendance and a participatory attitude.

### 2. Learning results

Ability to identify and use directly the different philosophical sources in Greek language and to evaluate them critically . Ability to critically read philosophical texts in the Greek language taking into account that their interpretation is under permanent construction.

### 3. Syllabus

- Greek language. The alphabet.
- Introduction to the main phonetic characteristics of the Greek language.
- Introduction to Greek nominal morphology.
- Initiation to Greek verbal morphology.
- Introduction to the syntax of the Greek language.
- Analysis, translation and commentary of Greek philosophical texts

### 4. Academic activities

There will be brief theoretical presentations on the grammatical contents of the Greek language. The fundamental work in class will be based on the study of Greek texts of progressive difficulty and interest for their philosophical content, extracted from an anthology prepared by the teacher. Their analysis will be carried out taking into account the student's acquisition of the necessary skills to reach an initial level of understanding and management of the texts. The student will prepare texts for presentation in class and for personal work (directed by the teacher).

### 5. Assessment system

First call:

Continuous assessment

Test 1. Completion of an exercise consisting of the translation, analysis and commentary of texts seen in class. Attention will be paid to the accuracy and clarity of the analysis as well as the correct written expression of the content of the text (50% of the final average).

-Test 2: scheduled delivery of translation exercises from the anthology of texts according to a schedule to be agreed upon. Attention will be paid to the correction and progressive acquisition of a scientific terminology of grammatical analysis of the texts (30% of the final average).

-Test 3: delivery of the texts written in class according to the schedule established at the beginning of the term. The clarity and comprehension will be valued , as well as the progressive acquisition of resources for the study of the same (20%of the final grade).
