1. General information

The general goal of the subject is for students to be able to obtain a general vision of Psychology as a discipline and as a profession and to try to understand human behaviour through the application of scientific study and knowledge of the basic psychological processes that underlie it.

2. Learning results

4. Academic activities

- Theoretical and practical oral presentations with practical exercises to illustrate psychological phenomena.
- Voluntary oral presentations. Open space in which students can present practical or theoretical contents of a part of the program.
- Detection of students' previous ideas through open-ended questions.
- Readings, documents and audiovisual material to analyze, synthesize and/or make a critical assessment of the same.
- Gamification techniques: to motivate and deepen knowledge.
- Discussion forums
- Classroom research: designed by teachers or students to answer questions about the subject and/or to exemplify contents.
- On-site and on-line tutoring
- Individual or group supervised work

5. Assessment system

The progression of the students will be assessed in relation to the subject throughout the term. The evaluation is structured as follows :

a) Student contribution (25%)

Assessment of the subject's contributions to the subject: Class participation; Contributions in discussions; Completion of the practices; Completion of voluntary assignments and presentations.

b) Theoretical-practical knowledge of the subject (75%)

The contents will be assessed by means of a test or tests that will assess theoretical and practical aspects related to the subject . These tests may be oral or written.

In order to acquire the minimum knowledge and skills, students will be required to obtain a score equal to or higher than 4 in each of the previous sections (student contribution; supervised work).

If the student does not reach this minimum score in any section, the subject will be considered as not passed.

For students who have not been able or have not chosen to take the course during the course, will make an internship notebook in the section "a) Contribution of the student. If this modality is used, it must be indicated to the teacher within the first 15 days of the term.
