1. General information

The main goal of the course is to provide students with knowledge about the different benefits of the Social Services and the necessary skills on programming, implementation and assessment of social programs.

2. Learning results

Is able to plan and evaluate in Social Services, including quality management methods. Is capable of planning and evaluation in Social Services, including quality management methods. It differentiates the benefits of the Social Services, especially those referred to in the Catalog of Benefits of the Autonomous Community of Aragon and in the Dependency Law. It critically judges the role of benefits and programs in the function and mission of Social Work and the role of the social worker in the design, implementation and evaluation of social programs.

4. Academic activities

Participative lectures: sessions with the professor in which the subject matter will be explained: 30 hours Problems and cases: sessions to solve practical cases presented by the teacher: 27 hours

5. Assessment system

They will consist of:

I. Mixed system in continuous assessment, which is composed of the following assessment activities:

- Assessment of the activities carried out during the course (continuous assessment). Written knowledge test, 60%. It will be necessary to obtain a (5/10) to pass the subject and to average with the other assessment sections. Practices carried out in

class and delivery of an individual portfolio, 40%. It is mandatory to attend at least 80% of the practical classes.

II. Global assessment system (single)

- Written knowledge test, 70%. A score of (5/10) is required.

- Practical knowledge test 30%. Students who request it during the first four weeks of the term and who use this assessment system will be able to substitute the practical test for the delivery of an assessable dossier with activities proposed by the teacher that will be delivered at the time of the global test (Only for the first single assessment call).
