1. General information

The purpose of the *Economic Policy of Tourism* is that the student acquires a general vision of how the economic policy is capable of ordering and promoting tourism activity. The performance of different levels of government is analyzed: supranational, national, regional and local.

Tutoring, subject study, class preparation: 43 hours

Assessment tests: 2 hours

5. Assessment system

Continuous Assessment or Global Assessment may be chosen: a) CONTINUOUS ASSESSMENT

It consists of the following activities:

-Individual written test (60% of the mark, minimum 5 out of 10)

About the theoretical contents of the subject.

-Student Portfolio (40% of the grade, minimum 5 out of 10)

It will consist of a dossier of works: readings, press, reports, etc.

At least 70% of the activities must be delivered.

b) OVERALL ASSESSMENT

It consists of:

• Individual written test (80% of the grade, minimum 5 out of 10)

About the theoretical contents of the subject.

• Dossier of work (20% of the grade)

Elaboration of a dossier of individual activities similar to the one elaborated in the Continuous Assessment.

If the student has completed the portfolio during the term, the Continuous Assessment weightings will be maintained.
