1. General information

The subject Aviation Law prepares the future pilot in all the legal and regulatory issues that they must know to develop their professional activity with due rigor in these matters. The contents of the subject are based on international regulations.

The course is divided into three main blocks:

International aviation law.

Organization and Spanish legislation on the subject.

Legislation associated with military aviation.

2. Learning results

Upon completion of the subject, the student will be able:

- 1- To understand the main concepts of international aviation law.
- 2- To understand the Spanish organization and legislation on the subject.
- 3- To know the aspects related to the legislation associated with military aviation.

- 3. Aircraft nationality and registration marks.
- 4. Personnel Licensing.
- 5. The rules of the air.

- 7. Air traffic services and air traffic management.
- 8. Aeronautical information service.
- 9. Aerodromes.
- 10. Facilitation (Annex 9 ICAO).

- 13- Investigation of aeronautical incidents and accidents.
- 14- Regulation 216/2008.

4. Academic activities

The proposed learning activities are mainly:

- -Presentation of the contents of the subject in lectures. If it is not possible to teach face-to-face for health reasons, it will be done telematically.
- -Resolution, by the student, of theoretical/practical problems.
- -Preparation of practical work on an individual basis.
- -Study and analysis of news and real cases related to the subject.

5. Assessment system

FIRST CALL

Continuous assessment

- +Practical work to be done throughout the term (40% of the final grade):
- -Active participation in the activities proposed in the Virtual Classroom (5%)
- -Oral and written presentation of an original paper (10% and 25% respectively)
- +Written tests (exams) during the term on theoretical, practical or theoretical-practical aspects (60% of the final grade of the subject 30%+30%)

In order to pass the subject, the student must obtain a final grade of 5 or higher.

Overall Test

Students who do not pass the subject by continuous evaluation or who would like to improve their grade, will have the right to take the overall test set in the academic calendar, prevailing, in any case, the best of the grades obtained. This global test will be equivalent to the continuous evaluation tests described above and will have a 100% weight in the final grade.

It will consist of passing a two-part test:

An examination, which will consist of two essay questions and a test.

An oral examination, which will consist of a brief presentation of the most relevant legal news related to aviation law

SECOND CALL

Students who do not pass the subject in the first call may sit for an overall exam set in the academic calendar for the second call. This global test will consist of a written exam that covers the entire syllabus of the subject, and will have a weight of 100%. In order to pass the subject, the student must obtain a final grade of 5 or higher.
